Genesis of the Organization

SISTRY FOUNDATION is a non-political, non-communal, non-profit making and non-Governmental organization, the main objective of which is to cause socio-economic empowerment of the poor and marginalized with a prime focus on the distressed and downtrodden Children. SISTRY FOUNDATION actually started with the joint effects of some enthusiastic youth (boy & girls) by organizing game & sport and some cultural program since 2008. This was temporary programme & seasonal basis with the gradual Expansion of its games, sport and cultural wings this organization group feels to build a permanent youth club & for this purpose they came forward & convene a meeting for this purpose. All of them healthily accepted the noble proposal of the Founder Group.

The founder of this Trust then started organizing sports & cultural programme throughout the year. As the area is very much backward and interior the people of this area are very ignorant and illiterate. Due to this, founder of the Trust organized several awareness camp and Adult literacy programme for women. For this purpose they also collected local contribution with high satisfaction. #### (i) Farmers Producer Organisation:

The concept of 'Farmer Producer Organizations, (FPO)' consists of collectivization of Producers especially small and marginal farmers so as to form an effective alliance to collectively address many challenges of agriculture such as improved access to investment, technology, inputs and markets.

NABARD provides financial and technical support to the producer organization and NABARDhas set up a Farmers' Technology Transfer Fund (FTTF) to be used to facilitate transfer of technologies and market linkages especially through Farmers' Clubs besides need based support for formation of Producers' Groups of farmers' Clubs etc.

During the year under report SISTRY FOUNDATION has given training the farmers through FPO at Purba and Paschim Bardhaman district. 2500 farmers have been trained during the 2019 – 2020 financial year.

#### (ii) Farmers Capacity Building:

Around 80% of the Purba and Paschim Bardhaman population depends on agriculture for their livelihoods. The majority farming at a subsistence level using traditional methods. However the context of agriculture in Bardhaman is changing with increasing challenges of reduced soil fertility, erratic weather patterns due to climate change and changing markets overall make a market oriented company. In order tocounter these challenges, small farmers need to change the way they farm in terms of what they grow and how they grow it, but they have no skills, knowledge and capacity to improve their productivity within this context.

SISTRY FOUNDATION acknowledges the need to support and train farmers so that they can reach their potential capacity for farming, and thus implements a series of interconnected activities that address the challenges facing member capacity.

#### (iii) Organic Farming:

Organic agriculture is a unique production management system which promotes and enhances agro-ecosystem health, including biodiversity, biological cycles and soil biological activity, and this is accomplished by using on-farm agronomic, biological and mechanical methods in exclusion of all synthetic off-farm inputs

SISTRY FOUNDATION teaches the farmers through training that a natural balance needs to be maintained at all cost for existence of life and property.

During the year under report SISTRY FOUNDATION trained 500 farmers in Purba and Paschim Bardhaman district in West Bengal.

Local varieties such as radish, broad leaf mustard, chili, beans, pumpkins etc.

**Kitchen gardening** is something all of us can do to make our cities greener. It's a **garden where** you grow your own food— herbs, vegetables, fruits. What's more, it gives city dwellers a chance to produce their own food—fresher, healthier—and learn in the process about local varieties.

#### ii) Alternative Farming:

'Alternative Farming' as it applies to the area of agriculture can be defined as 'A systematic approach to farming intended to reduce agricultural pollution, enhance sustainability, and improve efficiency profitability.

The term 'Alternative agriculture 'as it applies to the area of agriculture can be defined 'A systematic approach to farming intended to reduce agricultural pollution, nhance sustainability, and improve efficiency and profitability. Overall, alternative agriculture emphasizes management practices that take advantage of natural processes (such as nutrient cycles, nitrogen fixation, and pest-predator relationships), improve the match between cropping patterns and agronomic practices on the one hand and the productive potential and physical characteristics of the land on the other, and make selective use of commercial fertilizer and pesticides to ensure production efficiency and conservation of soil, water, energy, and biological resources. Examples of alternative agricultural practices include use of crop rotation, animal and green manures, soil and water conserving tillage systems, such as no-till planting methods, integrated pest management, and use of genetically improved crops and animals. Consonant with sustainable agriculture, alternative agriculture focuses on those farming practices that go beyond traditional or conventional agriculture, though it does not exclude conventional practices that are consistent with the overall system'.

#### iii) Cattle Farming:

Cattle farming is done for two purposes: Dairy: for getting milk. Draught: animals are used for agricultural tasks like tilling, irrigation and carting. ... Milch breeds (dairy animals): These include the animals which are kept for obtaining milk.

The cattle farm is considered to improve farmers' total **income** and to boost their living conditions. As a means of manure for soil enrichment and as a source of bio fuel, the animal waste which is produced can be used. For a significant number of people, it is a source of employment.
